

FUNERAL RITES FOR MISS ANNIE M'MILLAN TODAY

**Aged Former School Teacher
Will Be Laid to Rest In
St. John's Cemetery**

Funeral services for Miss Annie E. McMillan, 80, who taught in public schools of Pensacola and Escambia county for 36 years before her retirement several years ago, will be held this morning at 10 o'clock from the family residence, 713 North Spring street. Miss McMillan died Thursday night.

Rev. J. Fletcher McLeod, pastor of First Methodist church, will officiate. Pallbearers will be: Wiley McDavid, W. C. Mackey, Lawrence Mayo, J. S. Leonard, A. E. Foster and O. J. Semmes, Jr. Burial will be in St. John's cemetery, with Fisher-Pou in charge.

Safety patrol boys of Annie McMillan school, named in her honor, will act as an honorary escort. This patrol won this year's safety award and Miss McMillan as well as the boys were proud of the achievement.

Miss McMillan began her teaching career 62 years ago in a one-room log cabin school in the rural district. In 1909 she accepted the principalship of old school No. 35. In 1912 the building later known as Annie E. McMillan school was opened with Miss McMillan as principal. For several years before her retirement in 1933 she was principal of the primary department of P. K. Yonge school.

Miss McMillan left the teaching profession in 1889 and was a clerk in the office of her brother, Angus McMillan, circuit court clerk, until 1919, when she re-entered the teaching field.
