

FUNERAL OF HARRY A. SMITH, VETERAN ENGINEER, SUNDAY

Services From Home, 513 N.
9th; Masons and Knights
of Pythias Member.

Funeral of Harry A. Smith, 68, veteran Louisville and Nashville engineer, who died Thursday night at his home, 513 North Ninth avenue, will be held Sunday afternoon at 5 o'clock from the residence. Known among his friends and fellow-workers as "Uncle Harry," he had been an employe of the railroad for 35 years.

Dr. William McIlwain, president of Palmer College at DeFuniak Springs and formerly pastor of Knox Presbyterian church, will conduct the services at the home. The Masonic fraternity and Knights of Pythias, of which he was a member, will hold their burial rites at the grave. Burial will be in St. John's cemetery.
