Large crowds attended the funeral of Lieut. Charles B. Burke held at 3:30 o'clock Sunday afternoon at the First Methodist Church. Chaplain W. W. Edel of the naval air station officiated. Burial was in St. John's cemetery.

Pensacola Elks and naval air station sailors attended the funeral in a body. The parents of the dead airman arrived during the day from Knoxville, Tenn., to attend the funeral.

Lieut. Burke lost his life Friday when the seaplane he was piloting fell into Pensacola Bay. The machine went into a tail spin and could not be righted in the short distance of 200 feet it had to travel. Efforts to revive him failed.
