

FUNERAL OF F. R. GOULDING TO-DAY

Will Be Held This Afternoon and
Veterans Will Attend in
a Body.

The remains of Frank Ross Goulding, who met death Thursday night while on guard duty at Flomaton, will be interred this afternoon, the body to be placed at rest in St. John's cemetery.

Mr. Goulding being a Confederate Veteran and a member of the local camp, the pall bearers have been selected from among the members of Camp Ward. They are N. B. Cook, W. L. Wittich, D. B. Reed, C. V. Thompson, F. C. Brent and D. G. Brent.

The cortege will leave the family residence, corner Davis and Sixth avenue at 3:30 o'clock and proceed to St. Katharine's church, where the services will be conducted by rev. Whaley and Rev. Sharp, after which it will move to the cemetery, and the remains be placed at rest in the family lot.

The bereaved widow and family of the deceased received many messages of condolence during yesterday and the day previous from persons who had known Mr. Goulding during his long and honorable career.
