

### Death of Mr. James N. Moreno.

After a long and painful illness—a complication of liver and heart troubles—Mr. James N. Moreno died at his home, 323 West Gregory street, at 4 o'clock yesterday afternoon.

At the time of his death he was vice consul at this port for Mexico.

Mr. Moreno was a native of Pensacola and his father before him was born here. He was 61 years and 3 months of age. This is the first death that has occurred in his family since he was married in 1860.

He entered the Confederate service during the civil war with the Second Alabama regiment as a member of the Mobile Cadets and was in the battle of Seven Pines. Afterward he was appointed quartermaster and was stationed at the Talladega camp of instruction.

He is survived by his wife, three sons and two daughters—Rev. Eben D. Moreno, Messrs. Scarritt and Mansfield Moreno, Mrs. J. M. Coe and Miss Violet Moreno.

The funeral will take place this afternoon. The cortege will move from the family residence at 3:30 o'clock and the funeral services will be conducted at Christ church at 4 p. m. Interment at St. John's cemetery.
