

GEN. MILLER EXPIRED AT PT. WASHINGTON

AGED GENTLEMAN WHO HAS
RELATIVES AND FRIENDS HERE
DIES AT RIPE OLD AGE.

General William Miller, well and favorably known in Pensacola, and having relatives here, died yesterday at his home at Ft. Washington, Fla., at an age of over eighty years. The information concerning the

death of the noted old soldier was meagre as received here. Ft. Washington proper is isolated from telegraph lines, and it was not possible to get full information regarding his demise.

Gen. Miller was an uncle of Mrs. C. W. Hagerman, of this city, and has often visited here. As often as he came, a cordial welcome awaited and was extended him. He was a veteran of the civil war, and was one of the few remaining soldiers who took part in the Mexican war. In fact during the days of 1861-'65, he was one of the foremost men of the state. At the engagement at Natural Bridge, near Tallahassee, he led the southerners to victory.

Although in feeble health, he responded to the call of the people in his district some years ago, and represented Washington and Calhoun counties in the state senate. Recently, however, his health began to fail fast, and it was not surprising to those who knew of his condition to receive the information of his death.
