

HENRY G. BAARS PROMINENT LAND OWNER, IS DEAD

Widely Known Man Stricken
Suddenly at Home, Dies
A Short While Later

Henry G. Baars, member of a prominent Pensacola family, died suddenly of a heart attack in the Pensacola hospital at 8:45 p.m. Saturday. He was stricken at his home, Cordova Park, a short while before. He was 41 years old.

Mr. Baars, a large land owner, who had been connected with the real estate and export lumber business, was taken to the hospital by his wife in their automobile, but died a short while after reaching there. He had not been previously ill, friends said.

Survivors include his wife, Mrs. Lelia C. Baars; two sons, Henry Baars, Jr., and Frank Ellison Baars; two brothers, John Ernest and Theo Baars, and a sister, Mrs. Annie E. Blandford, all of Pensacola.

Funeral services will be conducted by the Rev. Henry Bell Hodgkins in Christ Episcopal church at 4 p.m. today and at St. John's cemetery, where interment will be made. Pallbearers will be: A. Morley Darby, Fred Gillmore, Jr., Horace Quina, Carl Taylor, Herman White, Eugene Taylor, George Brent and Walter White.
